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
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It's time to set sail! Decorate the Jolly Oyster for its voyage.



GROW YOUR OWN POTATOES

What to do:

1. Fill the bottom of the container with sand or small rocks to help with drainage. 

2. Spread at least 6 inches of the growing soil on top of the sand or small rocks. 

3. Cut the seed potatoes into quarters, making sure each section has at least two sprouted eyes. 

4. Place the pieces 6 inches apart on top of the soil, sprouts pointing upward. 

5. Add 3 to 4 more inches of moist soil on top of the potato pieces. 

6. Water the sprouts every 3 to 5 days, or when the soil feels completely dry. 

7. After about 4 weeks, you will see green sprouts shooting up through the soil. 

8. For every 7-10 inches of growth, add 3-4 more inches of soil on top of the sprouts (gently, without packing them down) until the soil reaches the top of the container. (This is called "mounding up.") 

9. After 60 to 80 days, the plants will sprout flowers. 

10. When the flowers on the plants start to wither and drop off, this means the potatoes are ready to be harvested. 

11. Dig up, wash, and enjoy! 

What you need:

- 70-100 days, depending on the variety of your potatoes
- Sunny outdoor area
- Seed potatoes or sprouted potatoes (Washed potatoes from the grocery store should take 10-14 days to sprout in a dark, cool place.)
- A large container (a 30-gallon garbage can is ideal), with small holes in the bottom for drainage
- Growing soil (well-drained, sandy soil with a pH of 6.0-6.5)
- Enough sand/ small rocks to cover the bottom of your container
- Optional: Compost or 15-15-15 Fertilizer

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
